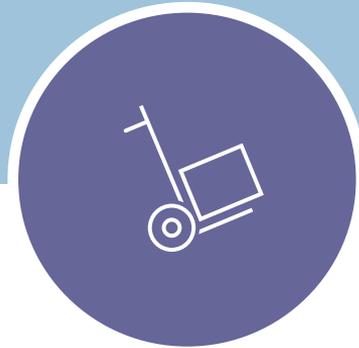

### Submitting centre marks

- Marks can be submitted to OCR via EDI and Interchange
- Postal moderation option: marks must be posted to the OCR moderator
- Digital moderation option: marks are uploaded to our secure system

## Internal appeals procedure

Centres are required to have a written internal appeals procedure relating to internal assessment decisions and to ensure that details of this procedure are communicated, made widely available and accessible to all candidates

Centres must inform candidates of their centre assessed marks as a candidate can request a review of the centre's marking **before marks are submitted to the awarding body**

## Authentication forms

Candidate authentication and centre authentication (CCS160) forms do not need to be sent to OCR or the OCR moderator \*

Authentication forms should be kept within the centre until all reviews of results, malpractice and appeals have been resolved

\* Specific candidate authentication forms must be submitted with the centre sample for **GCSE, AS and A Level Design and Technology and A Level Geography**

## GCSE English Language J351

Teachers do not need to submit a sample of audio-visual recordings for monitoring for the **Spoken Language endorsement** in summer 2022

The Spoken Language assessment can:

- Take place in front of one teacher who will represent the 'audience'
- Be conducted virtually at any point during the course

Teachers will still need to keep secure records of students' assessment outcomes, should we need to refer to them



# NEA Centre Declaration Form

We've updated the OCR NEA Centre Declaration Form for summer 2022

This form must be completed by your Head of Centre and submitted to us by **15 May** for the following qualifications:

### GCSE English Language (J351) – Spoken Language Statement

## GCSE Computer Science J277

We updated our GCSE Computer Science qualification to meet Ofqual's requirement to assess practical programming skills by external examination from 2022

The entry code for the updated qualification is J277

First teach was September 2020 with first entry and assessment in summer 2022

Centres are required to give candidates the opportunity to develop programming skills during their course of study

---

To confirm that your centre has met the programming requirements laid out in the specification, the online **practical programming statement** must be completed and submitted by **15 May**

The statement must be completed by someone who can declare that the requirements have been met. This may be your Head of Centre or Head of Department

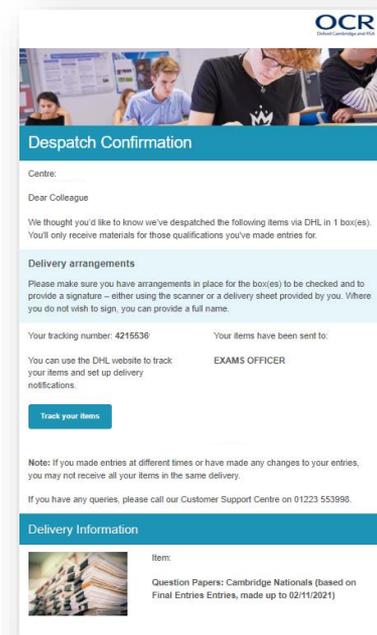

## Scribe Cover Sheet?

Make sure the candidate completes the front cover of the question paper or answer booklet

Where an application for a scribe is processed using Access Arrangements Online, print a pre-populated scribe cover sheet from the system



## Treasury Tags?

Please don't use treasury tags or staples to attach additional answer booklets, word-processed pages or cover sheets to the exam script

These should be inserted inside the candidate's exam script



## Word Processor Cover Sheet?

Make sure the candidate completes the front cover of the question paper or answer booklet

You no longer need to use a word processor cover sheet. However, if you would like to use one, we have provided one for you

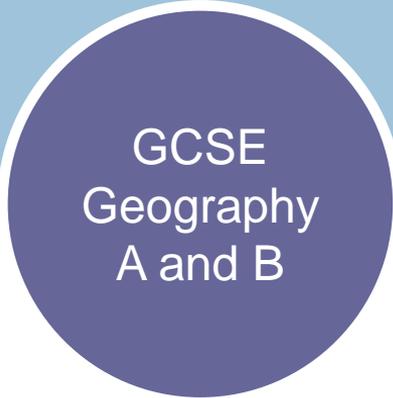

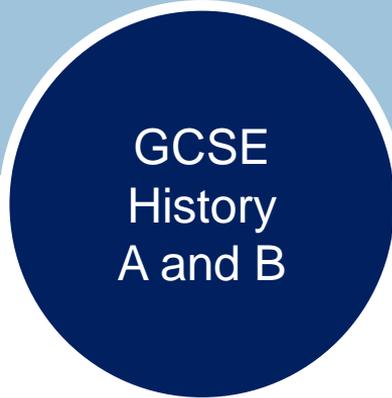

- If a candidate has been disadvantageded by **sitting the wrong paper**, apply for special consideration as 'absent' for the paper they missed. Keep the original entry if it was correct before the wrong paper was taken. Do not change entries to match the wrong paper
- If a candidate **leaves the exam early** and you are applying for special consideration then please let us know how long they were present for, as well as the duration of the overall exam
